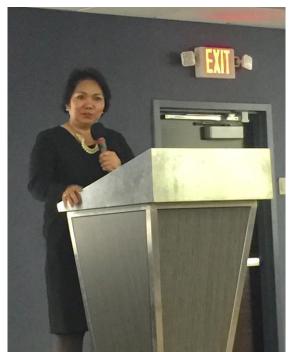
PHILIPPINE CONSUL GENERAL WELCOMES FIL-AM BUSINESS DELEGATES TO CHICAGO
