Filipino Artists Showcase Pride and Culture at the "Filipino History Unveiled Through the Arts" Exhibit at Trickster Gallery

The Consulate General of the Philippines in Chicago attended the opening reception of an exhibit entitled "Filipino History Unveiled Through the Arts," on 16 September 2017 at the Trickster Gallery in Schaumburg, Illinois.

The exhibit featured work from over 15 Filipino artists as part of the kick-off celebration of the Filipino American History Month (FAHM).

The highlight of the event is the unveiling of the 28-foot long mural painting using some of the 10,000 artifacts from the Philippine collected by the Field Museum as inspiration. The mural was made possible
